

C1 Ulva Ferry Community Transport

- Set up in 2014 after the demise of the postbus a few years earlier
- 2 electric vehicles adapted for wheelchairs, bookable on-demand subject to driver availability
- Scheduled minibus service 3 days a week which connects with onward bus services
- For locals and visitors
- Other services include patient transport and prescription pickup

C2 Transport for Tongue

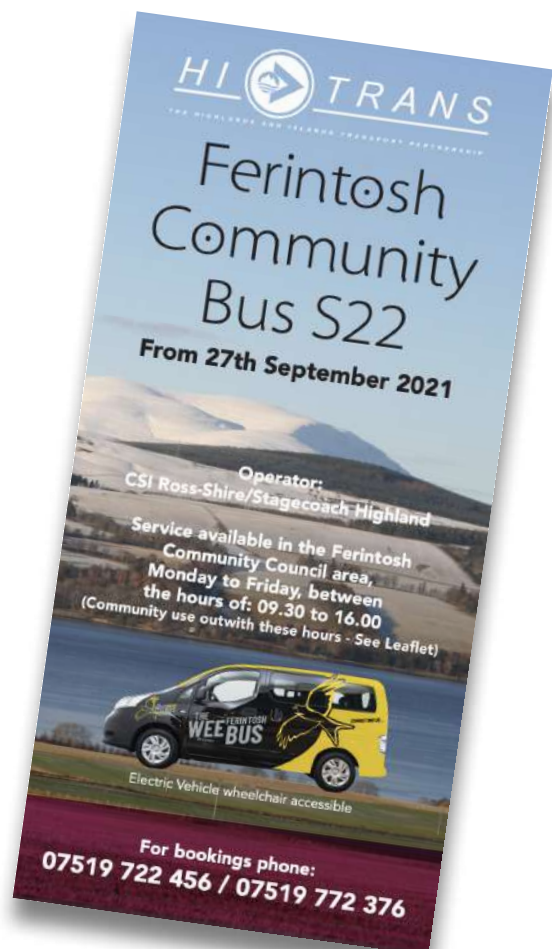
- Registered weekly timetabled bus services to Lairg and Inverness from Tongue, Melness and Skerry in Sutherland
- Uses accessible minibus with wheelchair access
- £10/year lift share scheme for local door-to-door transport with volunteer drivers
- Community-led, population < 600

C3 Ferintosh Wee Bus

- Electric 5 seater van with wheelchair space
- Operates in Ferintosh Community Council area on the Black Isle (based in Culbokie)
- Flexible bookable service
- Complements Stagecoach buses on A9
- Subsidised from public transport budget

C4 Roadside walking/cycling routes, Islay

C5 Glenelg community ferry

- Daily ferry service 10am-7pm between Glenelg and Skye
- Community-owned since 2007 - by Glenelg-based social enterprise Isle of Skye Ferry Community Interest Company
- Also built and own a new 'shore station' at the Glenelg slipway with cafe and shop
- Ferry has become a tourist destination in its own right
- Glenachulish Preservation Trust, a separate charity, raises funds to maintain the ferry (the MV Glenachulish, built 1969)
