
PURPOSE OF THE PLAN

KEY MESSAGES

Collaborative partnership of community action & public services

Need to do the whole package, not just pick off 1 or 2 projects

Depends on reallocation of budgets not just more money

Preparing the plan has been facilitated by BIP, funded by the Highland Council, led by the community

HOW WE GOT HERE



Aim: engage community on issues, aspirations and opportunities

Drop-in events in each Community Council area during afternoons/evenings

Targeted engagement with schools, youth groups, young adults, parent & toddler groups, lunch clubs, disability group, etc

Publicity via Chatterbox, posters, social media, ebulletins, community organisations, youth ambassadors, word of mouth



OPPORTUNITIES

Aim: share feedback from dropins and translate aspirations into deliverable actions

Community assemblies:

- One north, one south
- Publicise widely
- Everybody welcome
- Facilitated events
- Develop deliverable & workable solutions
- Discuss delivery
- Involve Council and other stakeholders
- Ask "How can you help?"
- Share outputs





Aim: draft the plan and check it with the community

Share draft plan for comment, online and hard copy

Consult Community Councils and Councillors for statutory 28 days

Finalise, publish and share the Plan with the Council




National Performance Framework

Highland Regional Spatial Strategy








We are a zero carbon, resilient and sustainable community who respect our marine and land biodiversity.
